Bob Cunningham is a nationally known non-profit leader whose career has focused on children's issues. He currently serves as CEO of the International Centre for Missing and Exploited Children, and as Executive Director for Learning Development for Understood. Bob also has many years of experience working in education as a teacher, evaluator, and administrator. He has also worked for several prominent mentoring organizations including the Edge Foundation, Eye to Eye, Youth Build USA, and City Year.

Bob holds degrees from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Teachers College at Columbia University, where he has also been an instructor in the Departments of Special Education and Curriculum and Teaching.
